

Five Generations of the Terry Family of Bucks County Pennsylvania

Generation One

1. **Thomas Terry**, born about 1653¹ of Middletown, Bucks, Pennsylvania;² he died before 28 May 1704³ in Bucks Co., Pennsylvania.^{4,5} Thomas married⁶ abt 1674 a **Bowden** (probably **Sarah**) born 1657 of West New Jersey (Burlington County, New Jersey now Bristol Twp, Bucks, Pennsylvania) daughter of Mordecai and Rebecca Bowden,^{7,8} some of the first settlers of what became Bristol Twp, Bucks County.^{9,10,11} On 14 Jul 1683 William Penn granted unto Thomas

Terry 100 acres of land near his father-in-law Mordecai Bowden.¹² He directed his surveyor, Thomas Holmes, to have surveyed 'unto Terry a piece on the back of Bowden's land' (recorded 1700/1).^{13,14,15}

Thomas and Sarah (Bowden) Terry had four known children, all probably born in Bucks:^{16,17}

- + 2 i. **JASPER TERRY**, born abt 1675 of Bucks, Pennsylvania. He married **Susannah** _____ of Bucks County.
- + 3 ii. **CLEMENT TERRY**, born abt 1677 of Bucks, Pennsylvania.
- + 4 iii. **THOMAS TERRY**, a cooper, was born abt 1679 of Southampton Twp, Bucks, Pennsylvania. He married **Mary** _____ of Bucks County.
- + 5 iv. **JOSHUA TERRY**, b. abt 1681 in Bucks County.

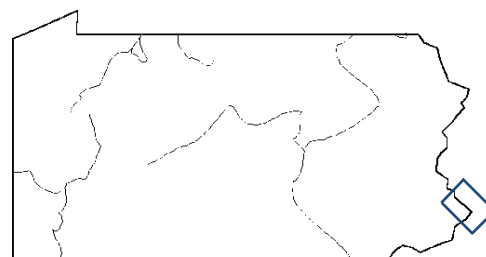
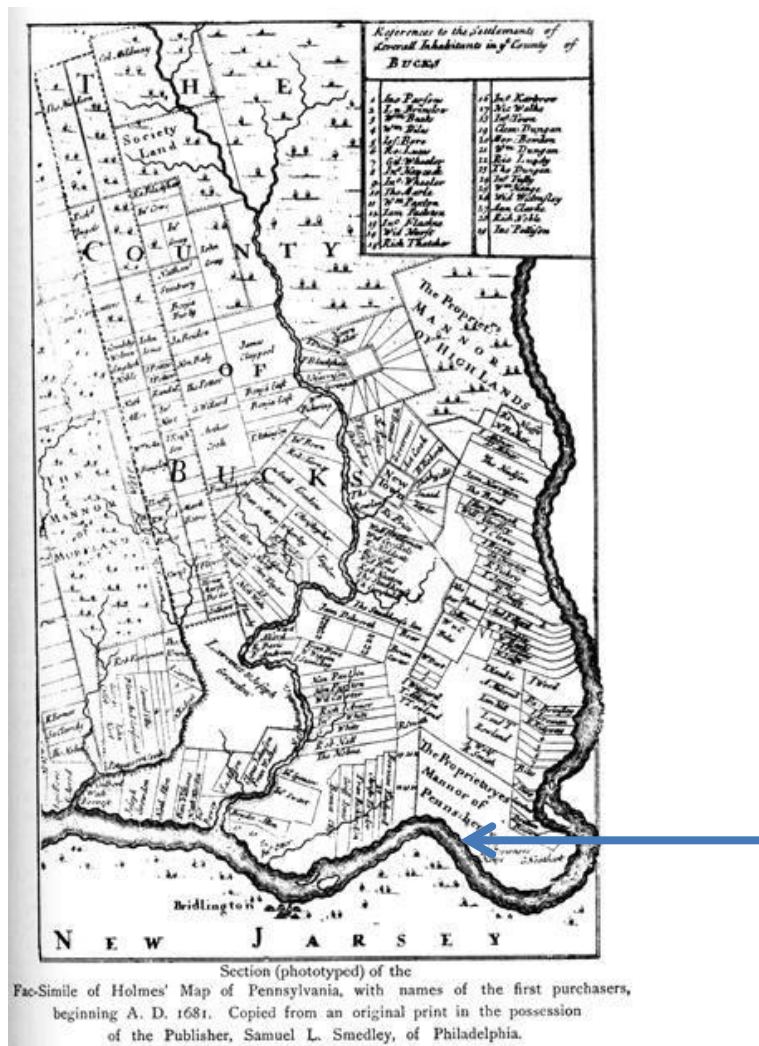

Thomas' origins are unknown, but DNA evidence has shown the Bucks County Terrys are very closely related to the Southold Long Island Terrys (see essay on this website: '[Addendum 1: Analysis of Y-DNA Markers Relevant to Thomas Terry of Bucks b 1653](#)'). Another essay, '[Origins of Thomas Terry, b. abt 1653](#)', is in preparation). He and his posterity over the next 2-3 generations had strong associations with the *Society of Friends* (Quakers).

ASSUMPTIONS

It is probably a good assumption that virtually all Terrys in Bucks County up to the twentieth century are descended from this Thomas Terry, b. abt 1653 and this genealogical essay is based on that assumption. Exceptions to this assumption are noted in the essay with reasons for exclusion from this family. In support of the assumption it should be noted that in the 1850 through the 1900 censuses of Bucks County, there is **no Terry not born in Pennsylvania**. Therefore, the known Terry families of Massachusetts (2), New York (L.I.), and Virginia did not migrate to Bucks County during this period.

It is also probably a good assumption that there were fewer migrating Terrys in the 17th and 18th centuries than in the 19th. Bucks County was and is desirable farmland and was settled for the most part in the late 17th and early 18th century; people looking for tillable land after that time were more likely to go to the Western Reserve (Ohio) as did several of the Bucks County Terrys. There are Terrys in the *Philadelphia County* 19th century censuses who were not born in Pennsylvania, but these are for the most part not migrating American Terrys, but Irish emigrants. This genealogy attempts to incorporate all known Terry evidence in Bucks County to date, but some of the family connections are therefore of necessity somewhat fanciful; effort has been made to identify these connections appropriately.

Generation Two

2. **Jasper Terry (Thomas¹)** was born abt 1675^{18,19} in Bucks County, Pennsylvania. He married in 1710 in Bucks, Pennsylvania **Susannah ____** of Bucks, Pennsylvania. She was born abt 1689.²⁰ Jasper of Bristol Township sold his father's patent in Falls Township in 1714 to John Bown (recorded Apr 7, 1715), witnessed by Edmond Lovett, Edmond Lovett, Jr. and William Baldwin.²¹

Jasper and Susannah Terry had three²² children all born in Bucks County:

- 6 i. **THOMAS TERRY** was born 1711, Makefield Township, Bucks, Pennsylvania; died 22 May 1792 Southampton, Bucks, Pennsylvania. He married **Jane Neeld**.
- 7 ii. **JOHN TERRY** was born 1713 Middletown, Bucks, Pennsylvania; died 1789 Wrightstown, Bucks, Pennsylvania. He married (1) **Rachel Heston Lacey** and (2) **Sarah Walmsley**.

NOTE: The descendants of **Thomas Terry (6)** and **John Terry (7)** have been separated into separate essays (see **Addendum 2. Descendants of Thomas Terry (1711-1792) of Bucks County Pennsylvania** and **Addendum 3. Descendants of John Terry (1713-1789) of Bucks County**, respectively).

- + 8 iii. **JASPER TERRY** was born abt 1715 of Falls Township, Bucks, Pennsylvania. He married 29 Jul 1735 at New Jersey **Mary Hart** daughter of Thomas and Ester (Miles) Hart of Falls Township, Bucks County.

3. **Clement Terry (Thomas¹)** was born abt 1677²³ in Bucks County, Pennsylvania and died 1763 in Bristol Borough, Bucks.²⁴ He married **Anne** _____.

Clement Terry and his wife had at least two children probably born in Bucks County:

- + 9 i. **CLEMENT TERRY Jr.**, a carpenter, was born abt 1700 in Bucks County and died after 1784 in Bristol Twp, Bucks. He married 17 Jul 1721 at the Presbyterian Church, Abington, Philadelphia County **Jane Johnson**.
- 10 ii. **ABRAHAM TERRY** of Bristol Twp, Bucks County.²⁵ It is not known whether he had a family, but he does not appear in the censuses or tax records of the period.

4. **Thomas Terry (Thomas¹)**, a cooper, was born abt 1679 of Southampton Twp, Bucks, Pennsylvania. He bought and sold land there (1714, 1730).²⁶ He married **Mary**_____ of Bucks County. He probably had children in Southampton Township.

5. **Joshua Terry (Thomas¹)** b. abt 1681 in Bucks County. He was a witness to a land record in 1706.²⁷ He probably had children in Makefield Township.

Generation Three

Due to the paucity of available primary sources for this period, descendant assignments have been very difficult. What assignments have been made are consistent with Pennsylvania Septennial Censuses²⁸ (tax records) and with the U. S. Censuses of Eastern Pennsylvania of the period 1790-1840.

8. Jasper Terry (Jasper² Thomas¹) born abt 1715 of Falls Township, Bucks, Pennsylvania.²⁹ He married³⁰ 29 Jul 1735 at New Jersey **Mary Hart** daughter of Thomas and Ester (Miles) Hart of Warminster Township, Bucks County. He (and cousin William) bought³¹ land 13 Dec 1744 in Augusta County, Virginia (at that time Augusta County was immense including present Botetourt).

Thomas “the Elder” Hart was born 1685 at Byberry Township, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. They were very active Quakers. Mary was their oldest born abt 1718 at Warminster, Bucks, Pennsylvania. They had other children: (2) Aaron born 1733 at Augusta County, Virginia, (3) Thomas Hart (md **Mary Morgan**), (4) Miles Hart born abt 1737 (md **Delilah**).³²

Jasper and Mary followed her father south to Botetourt County, Virginia; no more is discovered of them in Bucks County.^{33,34}

Jasper and Mary (Hart) Terry had a son:

- 11 i. **JOSEPH TERRY**, born abt 1737 of Bucks, Pennsylvania; apparently raised by his uncle John Terry.^{35,36,37}

9. Clement Terry Jr. (Clement² Thomas¹)^{38,39} born abt 1700 in Bucks County, Pennsylvania; died after 1784 of Lower Makefield Twp, Bucks.^{40,41,42} He probably died before the 1790

census⁴³ as he would have been abt 90 years and the Clement of the census (Upper Makefield Twp, not Bristol) had smaller children in his household (all females). He married⁴⁴ 17 Jul 1721 at the Presbyterian Church, Abington, Philadelphia County **Jane Johnson**.

Clement Terry and his wife had children in Bucks County.⁴⁵

- + 12 i. **WILLIAM TERRY**,⁴⁶ born 1724 at Bucks, Pennsylvania lived most of his life in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia (Botetourt County).

- 13 ii. **JANE TERRY**, born abt 1725 of Bucks, Pennsylvania.⁴⁷ She married 20 Jan 1745 at New Jersey **Robert Smith** of Bucks.⁴⁸
- 14 iii. **LAWRENCE TERRY**, born abt 1725 of Lower Makefield. He was witness to the Jos. Hutchison will in Falls Twp in 1749.⁴⁹
- + 15 iv. **DANIEL TERRY**, born abt 1735 of Bucks, Pennsylvania.
- + 16 v. **JOSHUA TERRY**, born abt 1745 at Bucks, Pennsylvania and died before 1790; he is not in the 1790 census or tax records of the period. He married ____ **Winner** of Lower Makefield, Bucks, daughter of John Winner (from her father's will proved 1791).⁵⁰

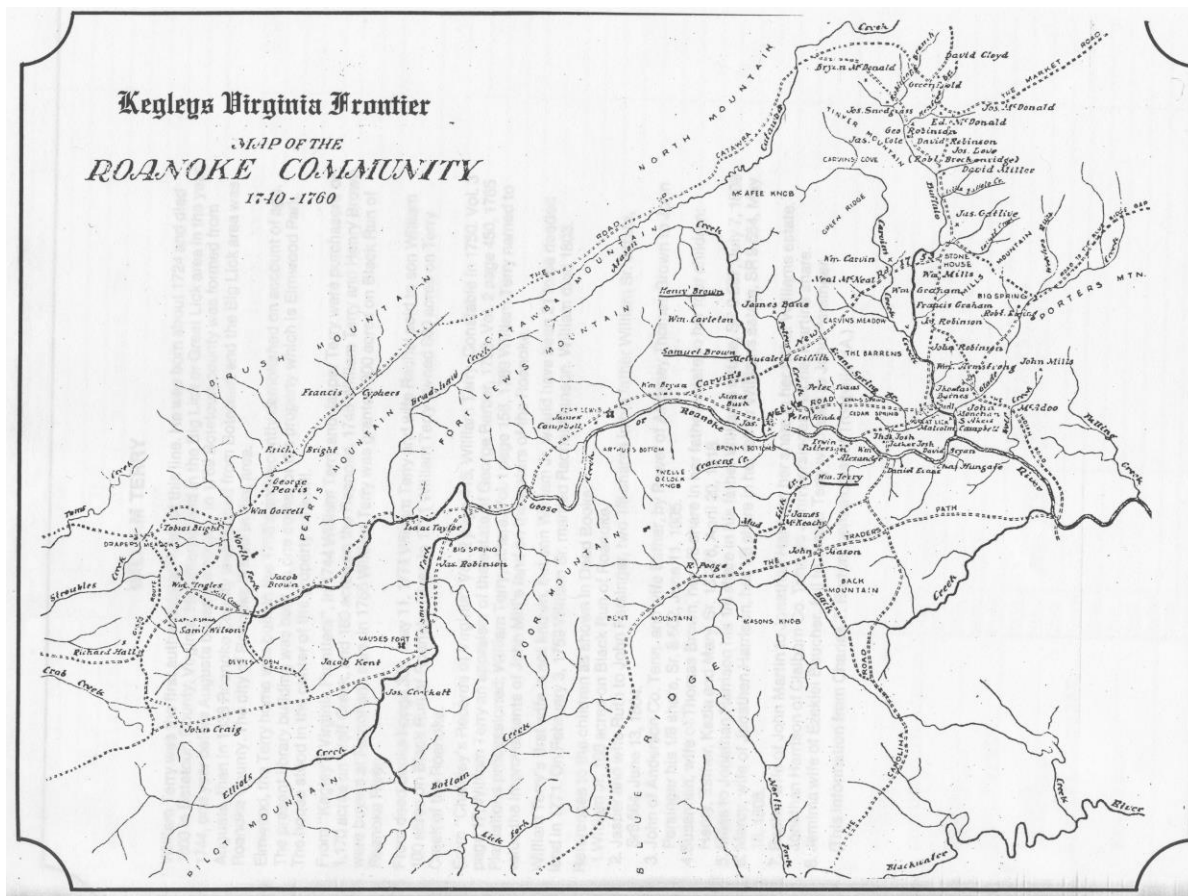


Figure 3. Roanoke area showing lands of William Terry, the Browns, and Mud Lick Run. From F. B. Kegley, *Kegley's Virginia Frontier: the beginning of the Southwest, the Roanoke of colonial days, 1740-1783* (Roanoke, VA: Southwest Virginia Historical Society, 1938).

In 1750 Wm was appointed constable and in 1757 William, Sr. and Jasper (his cousin) were employed to survey all the roads.⁵⁵ William worked often with his cousin Jasper⁵⁶ and Jasper's

50 i. **JOHN TERRY**, Jr. was born (calc) 13 May 1814 at (possibly Southampton) Bucks, Pennsylvania and died 25 Nov 1849. He married¹²⁰ 12 Nov 1835 **Catherine Cornell** dau of Gillian and Jane (Craven) Cornell (he b. abt 1780 and she b. 1784).¹²¹ Catherine was born 9 Aug 1806 and died 28 Aug 1883; both are buried¹²² in the North and Southampton Churchyard, Churchville, Bucks. Catherine was widow in New Britain in 1883;¹²³ she died 28 Aug 1883 at son-in-law Harvey Haldeman's home in New Britain, Bucks.¹²⁴ John and Catherine (Cornell) Terry had two daughters:¹²⁵ Jane Elizabeth Terry was born¹²⁶ 1838 of Northampton Twp, Bucks, Pennsylvania; she married¹²⁷ 8 Jan 1857 at Doylestown, Bucks **Ephraim H. Fretz**. Mary Angerine/Andurean Terry born abt 1845 of Bucks and died¹²⁸ 26 Oct 1920; she married¹²⁹ **Harvey Haldeman** of New Britain Twp.¹³⁰

OTHER BUCKS COUNTY TERRYS THAT CANNOT BY ANY DIRECT EVIDENCE BE TIED TO THE THOMAS TERRY 1653 LINEAGE.

These Terrys are divided into two groups: The first group comprises Terrys that are *likely or proven descendants* of Thomas Terry of Bucks (b. 1653) but supportive evidence is not available. The second is comprised of those ‘cousins’ (see ‘Addendum 1. Analysis of Terry Y-DNA Markers’, this website) that are probable descendants of the Southold (Long Island, New York) Terrys, but who lived and generated sources in or near Bucks County.

Group 1. These Terrys of Bucks County are likely the 2nd great- grandsons or great-grandsons of Thomas Terry (b. abt 1653) of Bucks by unknown linkage through his sons **Clement Terry (3) b. abt 1677, Thomas Terry (4) b. abt 1679, or Joshua Terry (5) b. abt 1681. It is not likely that any are descended through the first son Jasper (2).**

A. THOMAS TERRY_of Ohio, b. abt 1750 of Bucks and died before 1830 of Ohio; the key reference is his Bucks County 1779 marriage record *vide infra*. It was originally believed that Sarah Ashburn was a second wife to Thomas Terry, son of Thomas and Jane (Neeld) Terry. However, that Thomas’ wife Olly Davis died 1841 and is buried at Pennepack, Philadelphia County. Susanna Terry’s will (a dau of Thomas and Jane (Neeld) Terry *vide supra* indicates Olly was a widow in 1805 and does not name Thomas_of_Ohio’s boys that were born in Bucks before Susanna died. Therefore there must be two Thomas Terry’s of Bucks, both born abt 1749.

Genealogy:

1. Thomas Terry was born abt 1755 of Bucks and died before 1830 at Alum Creek, Morrow, Ohio. He married 17 Jun 1779¹³¹ **Sarah Ashburn** b. 1752 daughter of John and Juliann (Jolly) Ashburn.¹³² They were Quakers. About 1808 they moved from Bucks to Fairfield Township,¹³³ Highland County, Ohio (near Leesburg, the twp and county were created in 1805). Their

subsequent move from Fairfield Twp to Alum Creek (Peru Township), Morrow County, Ohio is recorded in the Fairfield Monthly Meeting records.^{134,135,136}

Thomas and Sarah (Ashburn) Terry had four children.¹³⁷

TERRY**, born abt 1782 of Bucks, Pennsylvania and died¹³⁸ 1837 at Leesburg, Highland, Ohio and is buried in the Fairfield Quaker Cemetery.¹³⁹ He married¹⁴⁰ 22 Dec 1807 at Halifax, Virginia **Elizabeth (Betsy) Anderson** dau of John and Rachel Anderson. She was born¹⁴¹ 16 Jul 1788 at Lynchburg, Campbell, Virginia and died 11 Apr 1864; buried in the Fairfield Quaker Cemetery.¹⁴² They had, among others, sons William P., Thomas, and James W. Terry; total of eight children.

C. **WILLIAM TERRY** late of Hatborough, Bucks married¹⁴⁴ 30 Sep 1827 **Mary Elvira Moore** of New Orleans.

D. **WILLIAM TERRY** married¹⁴⁵ **Grace Cooper**, both of Makefield Twp, Bucks 15 Mar 1834. Perhaps this is the William Terry, farmer, who died 16 Nov 1889 at Philadelphia, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania at age 75 (b. 1814) and is buried at Norristown, Montgomery, Pennsylvania.¹⁴⁶

E. **HIRAM TERRY** (b. abt 1829) husband of **Harriet Shaffer**.¹⁴⁷

F. **MARY TERRY** (b. 1783, d. 19 Feb 1877 of Bristol, Bucks), husband died before 1850; son Joseph V. Terry (b. 1803).¹⁴⁸

G. **EDWARD B. TERRY**, born 1841 of Philadelphia, died¹⁴⁹ 22 Feb 1906, son of James and Elizabeth Brown Terry, married **Mary W.**¹⁵⁰ She was born abt 1827 and died 29 Nov 1893 at Philadelphia.¹⁵¹ There is a James Terrey in Makefield Twp. in the 1840 census.¹⁵²

Group 2. These Terrys of Bucks County are likely NOT descended from Thomas Terry (b. abt 1653) of Bucks County.

A. RUTH TERRY (b. abt 1748) married **George Garland** 3 Nov 1768. Since she moved to Pennsylvania with her mother from Chesterfield Monthly Meeting (Burlington Co. New Jersey), she is judged to likely not be descended from Thomas Terry of Bucks.

A Quaker, she received a certificate 31 Dec 1762 from Chesterfield (Burlington, New Jersey) Monthly Meeting (a widow, with daus Ruth and Amey).¹⁸¹ She died 20 Feb 1790 at Philadelphia, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.¹⁸² Four children.

Isaac Banes Terry (Richard⁴ Richard³ Richard² Nathaniel¹)²¹⁴ born (calcd) 22 Apr 1812 of Moreland, Montgomery, Pennsylvania; he died 21 Jul 1883 at Southampton, Bucks, Pennsylvania and was buried in the Old School Baptist Meeting House Cemetery in Southampton.²¹⁵ He was taxed in Northampton Twp 1843-1848.²¹⁶ He married²¹⁷ abt 1836 **Martha Addis Streeper** daughter of William and Elizabeth (Carver) Streeper.^{218,219} She was born 15 Apr 1817 at Bucks County, Pennsylvania and died²²⁰ 17 Feb 1889 at Southampton, Bucks, Pennsylvania and was buried in the Old School Baptist Meeting House Cemetery in Southampton.²²¹

Isaac and Martha (Streeper) Terry had eight children.²²²
